Topic: Portrait Drawing Basics
Raymond Mendieta attended the Academy of Art University in San Francisco, where he received his undergraduate and Masters in Fine Arts.

Ray plans to draw a portrait for us from a live model. He will demonstrate how he makes decisions regarding composition, perspective, proportion, value, pattern and the use of light and shadow - key considerations for achieving a good likeness.

Today Ray's paintings are collected worldwide. He specializes in commissioned portraits and plein air landscapes, and has had numerous one-man shows. He also teaches at the Academy of Art University as well as The Pacific Art League in Palo Alto, CA.

Topic: The Art of Travel Sketching

Steve is a fine artist working in the medium of watercolor. Most of his work consists of landscapes and seascapes that have inspired him during his hikes and travels.

“Watercolor behaves just like nature: fresh, spontaneous, and elemental in its simplicity. It is a joyfully portable medium that affords me the opportunity to record my visual impressions quickly and with a natural freshness.”

“All of my paintings seek to capture my experience, where a turn in the trail has caught my eye, and I am again witness to the rush of beauty and the life force unfolding before me.”

Steve also teaches watercolor painting classes at the Pacific Art League in downtown Palo Alto, California where he resides.

January 3rd & 10th - Maison du Lac



The Mountain Retreat of Bill and Patti Hughs. Quiet Pond and lots of color: gardens, out buildings and farm equipment. This is an excellent site to bring a picnic lunch and paint well into the afternoon. Take 17 South to Summit Road. Go East on Summit Rd. and go left on Trail Ridge Road (about 1 mile

from 17 - look for rack of mailboxes on left). Take Trail Ridge about 1/4 of a mile and look for parking lot in redwood grove on right. Red cone will mark the parking area.

Thursday, January 6 - Alum Rock Park (10am)



115350 Penitencia Creek Road, San Jose. Many mineral springs; was once a turn of the century resort. 125 year old park with creek, stone bridges with old trees and romantic history. Take Penitencia Creek Road off Capitol Expressway. Go east into park and park in farthest parking lot from entrance. Bring a lunch and

enjoy the park. Fee \$6, \$2 for seniors.

January 17 & 24 - Villa Montalvo, Saratoga

Once grand estate of Senator Phalen, Villa Montalvo offers a lovely Mansion surrounded by formal gardens. Hidden water features make it a quiet and peaceful place. Take Montalvo Road off Saratoga Los Gatos Road and follow it around to the end. Meet in parking lot #3 to left of Mansion.

January 31 & Thursday, February 7 - Davenport



9.5 miles N. of Santa Cruz Some us didn't get enough of this site which offers industrial (cement Plant) Coastal cliffs/ Ocean and Monterey pines, small but historical and weathered downtown and coffee house and restaurants for after a fun day of painting.

**New meeting location. Take Hwy*

1 north from Santa Cruz to Davenport. Go past cement plant and make a left onto Davenport Landing Rd. (first left after cement plant) park in parking lot on left near ocean. Cliff views, picnic tables and facilities.

Thursday, February 3 - Seymour Marine Discovery Center-Santa Cruz (9:30)

Many fabulous vista from bluffs of ocean. Take Highway 17 South from San Jose. Take Highway One (Mission Street) North toward Half Moon Bay. Continue north through town several miles. Turn left on Swift Street. Turn right on Delaware Avenue. Follow Delaware to the UC Santa Cruz Marine Science Campus entrance at the end of the road. The Seymour Marine Discovery Center is the final building located on the ocean bluff, next to the giant blue whale skeleton.



February 14 - Lexington Reservoir

East side of 17 Take Bear Creek Rd, and go over highway 17 follow signs to reservoir. Park in first parking area. It is located approximately just past the dam off Alma Bridge Road.

February 21 - Lexington Reservoir (location 2)

East side of 17, Take Bear Creek Rd, and go over highway 17, follow signs to reservoir.

Park in The Miller Point day use area, located approximately 1.3 miles from the dam off Alma Bridge Road.



February 28 - Moss Landing Harbor

Highway One Working fishing harbor, old and new boats and interesting old buildings. Good eating places so bring a friend and make a day of it. Take 17 south to Watsonville exit. Go South past Watsonville and turn right at power plant onto Moss Landing Rd. Take the next right on Sandholdt Rd. Before bridge turn right into Moss Landing Harbor Parking lot. Great place to get up-close and personal with fishing boats and Elkhorn Slough.
